## CALL FOR POSTERS

Poster presentations provide a space for interdisciplinary discussions among various scholars. The intent of the Climate Bridge Conference is to foster a collaborative dialogue among planners, designers, scholars, scientists, public administrators, instructors, students, and policy makers from both sides of the Atlantic. **Posters should highlight contemporary investigations and approaches to address the environmental, scientific, economic, political, social, cultural, and/or spacial design dimensions of climate change. This call is intentionally open and interdisciplinary.**

Posters will provide the opportunity to share in-progress or finished research, designs and other explorations that lend themselves to a visual presentation of creative thoughts and ideas. **Scholars, scientists, practitioners, and students in Germany and the United States are invited through a virtual or in person format to contribute their work to the discussion.**

The diversity of submitted posters will allow participants to compare and contrast different approaches that address common challenges. **The goal is to encourage ingenuity to examine solutions to mitigate the impending climate crisis while seeking to moderate the impacts of climate change from rising temperatures, extreme precipitation and sea level rise.** Within the context of planning and policy, we must also address the growing awareness of social equity and environmental justice.



The three conference themes – PEOPLE, PLACE, and POLICY – will recognize cultural differences while establishing common ground for a comparative discussion. For more information on the themes, please visit the conference website at <https://cues.rutgers.edu/climate-bridge-conference/>

Scholars from different Universities in Germany and the U.S. will contribute papers and discussion that highlight interdisciplinary approaches to addressing the environmental, economic, political, and social dimensions of planning considering climate change.

## GUIDELINES FOR ONLINE AND/OR IN PERSON POSTER SUBMISSION:

### STEP 1

- Please send an email with an expression of interest in submitting a poster to [climate.bridge.poster@gmail.com](mailto:climate.bridge.poster@gmail.com) by **Sunday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021**.
- Please include an abstract (max. 200 words).
- An email will be sent to you to create a profile for the conference, including your **personal upload link**.

### STEP 2

- **Posters can be on any scholarly investigation related to climate change.**
- To submit a poster, online or in person, registration for the conference is required. Only 1 lead-authored submission per registered attendee.
- **Printed poster maximum size is ARCH E (3' wide x 4' tall) or A0 (84.1cm x 118.9cm) and are not to be mounted posters.**
- Maximum of 1 poster per submission.
- All **digital poster submissions must be in PDF format, maximum 10 MB per poster.**
- **Videos** are optional and may be submitted in common formats (e.g. **.mp4** and **.mov**) but must not exceed 50 MB
- All required fields in the poster profiles must be completed.
- Posters are to be submitted through **Whova**, using your personalized upload link.

Posters are to be submitted no later than **Sunday October 10<sup>th</sup>, 11:59pm EDT.**
